

AWO / WJC 2025 Club Judging Announcement November 2024

In preparation for the **2025 AWO Provincial Competition**, the Wine Judges of Canada (**WJC**) is again offering to judge your **AWO Club Competition**. Clubs using WJC judges are eligible to enter more than one wine per class to the Ontario finals, as the WJC judge is authorised to send forward all Gold & Silver medal wines made by different winemakers.

Important Dates

Starting Now:

Talk to your club members about when you want to have your club competition and who you want to judge your wines. Get a rough sense for how many wines you will have at the club level. Each winemaker can only enter one wine per class at the provincial competition, but at the club competition each winemaker can enter as many wines as the club competition can accommodate. Each judge can comfortably judge 40 wines. There are extra fees that may apply and they are outlined further in this notice.

Jan 4 – 31 2025:

This is the window to request judges for your competition. This year we will send a link to your club rep on Jan 3rd, for a Jot Form which is an online way to enter the info. It will be similar to the method used to enter the provincial competition last year. Even though you may have your favourite judge that you know quite well, don't arrange with them directly. In order to be fair, judges will be assigned by the AWO/WJC on a first come first served basis. When you enter using the Jot Form it will be time stamped and sent in for approval. WJC judges are not permitted to judge their own club under any circumstances.

March 1 – May 4 2025

This is the timeframe allowed to conduct your club judging. Keep in mind that an early competition date may preclude some of the young or new-wine entries that may need until later in that timeframe to be ready. Some dates of note for next spring, are in mid-April with some religious holidays falling on the weekends.

May 7 2025

This is the deadline to submit all your club competition info to the AWO in order to be eligible for the provincial competition.

May 30 – June 1

AWO Provincial Competition

Fees:

Entrants must be AWO members in good standing. The 2025 AWO Club judging fee is **\$5.00** per bottle per judge (therefore a double-judged bottle is \$10.00). The maximum number of bottles per judge is 40. For every bottle **over** the 40 bottle per judge limit, the judging fee is \$7.00 per bottle per judge. The minimum charge is \$40.00.

A mileage fee of **\$0.40 per kilometer** based on the **round-trip** distance per judge will also be charged. There will not be any mileage charge for distances under 20 km. The judges will provide their mileage to the Judging Host or Club Rep on arrival. Car-pooling will be encouraged to reduce costs wherever possible. Most Judges are limited to travel within a 200 km radius of their home so you should try to use Judges from your area of the Province. If you request a Judge to travel more than 250 km one-way, your club will be responsible to provide overnight accommodation.

Payment:

The fees from club competitions are paid to **Wine Judges of Canada** – not to the AWO. The fees collected are used to fund the expenses associated with the Ontario competition, including accommodations & consumable supplies for judging over 800 entries, the purchase of medals and awards, and ongoing training of Judges.

Forms and fee payment for a Club Competition are to be completed on Competition Day prior to judging starting. A cheque made payable to the “Wine Judges of Canada” covering these fees must be provided directly to the Head Judge of the day or transferred to the WJC Treasurer.
